Nicholas Cobb

When he was four years old, Nicholas Cobb saw a homeless family living under a bridge. "It just didn't make any sense to me," he told NBC Nightly News. Then, he decided to do something about it. Nicholas began by collecting toiletries for the homeless and cleaning supplies for local homeless shelters. In 2009, at age 12, he started his own foundation, Comfort and Joy, to raise money to buy new coats for those living on the street. Through working with his Boy Scout troop, Nicholas raised \$24,000 and bought hundreds of coats for the homeless. And this is just the beginning of his inspiring story.



Cara Mendelsohn

A tireless advocate for expanded programs and services for the homeless and underserved in our community, Cara has immersed herself in educating and encouraging awareness of the homeless population in Collin County. Through her work at The Samaritan Inn, she helps ensure that men, women and children residing there gain access to GED classes, computer skills, job search training, financial literacy, plus a whole lot more! Hear her story about what touched her heart and how she became involved in helping transform lives.



Larry Howe

As co-founder of Plano Solar Advocates, Larry is part of this grass roots volunteer group of Plano residents whose mission is to increase awareness and use of solar energy for electricity generation in Plano. Larry is passionate about sharing his knowledge with area residents and working to make solar energy affordable for the local community. He has harnessed his own energy to introduce and teach an interactive, fun lesson on making solar cars through local elementary schools.



Christopher Parr

For some immigrants, getting involved and speaking up can be difficult. As a founding member of the Plano Multicultural Outreach Roundtable (MCOR), Chris has poured his energy into promoting the city's diversity by better serving its ethnic groups. He has helped the MCOR grow to provide a number of activities and community engagement workshops which help residents embrace the city's changing racial and ethnic diversity and make the community all-inclusive, through the Plano International Festival, the World Peace Table Tennis Tournament and the Asian American Heritage Festival.



Graciela Katzer

Passionate about connecting different ethnic groups within the community, Graciela puts time, effort and energy into the Plano International Festival. Serving as president of this non-profit, she guided the event through its expansion over the last few years. Believing in the importance of teaching and modelling environmental stewardship for the planet, she also introduced the idea of Zero Waste to the event. This addition involved training youth as Green Ambassadors who taught attendees how to reduce waste, recycle, compost and eliminate unnecessary trash from the landfill.



Take Action to Improve Air Quality

This ozone season, Be Air Aware to protect your health and take action to reduce air pollution. Plano residents can improve air quality by joining together to implement focused strategies on Air Pollution Action Days (or days when ozone levels are unsafe).
