



RE-ROOF RESIDENTIAL PERMIT REQUIREMENTS

CITY OF PLANO BUILDING INSPECTION DEPARTMENT

CONSTRUCTION DOCUMENT SUBMITTALS: One (1) copy of a permit application form must be completed.

FEE: Refer to the [fee schedule](#) for applicable fees

MATERIALS AND REQUIREMENTS: International Residential Code (IRC)–R902, R903, R904, R905 and R908 as amended [Ordinance 2018-11-16](#)

1. Where the existing roof covering is **wood shake, slate, clay, cement or asbestos-cement tile**, it must be removed before new roof covering is applied.
2. No **unpackaged shingles** (seconds) are to be used.
3. Replace all **rotten decking or rafters** as needed.
4. **All Individual** replacement **shingles or shakes** shall be a minimum **Class A, B or C**.
5. Metal panel, metal shingle and concrete and clay tile roof coverings require installation of non-combustible underlayment.
6. Solid wood decking is required for all wood shingle; shake roofs.

NOTE:

1. A **Homeowner** who is performing the work himself/herself, and if the property is his/her homestead, is not required to register as a general contractor.
2. There are two (2) inspections required:
 - a. **A partial final inspection** – is required on metal panel, metal shingle, and concrete and clay tile roof covering to check underlayment.
 - b. **A final inspection** – to verify that materials were properly installed and comply with code regulation. Effective 6-1-2003 a final inspection will now also require an attic inspection to verify vent piping thru the roof, rafters in position and water heater and a/c exhaust vents reinstalled properly.
3. Re-roof work not exceeding 25% of the roof does not require a permit.
4. Please contact Homeowner's Association for additional requirements from Deed Restrictions and Covenants.

CERTIFICATION OF FINAL ROOF INSTALLATION CITY OF PLANO BUILDING INSPECTION DEPARTMENTS

As a measure to ensure the safety of your home, a roof permit is required on all re-roof projects. The City of Plano provides a final roof inspection as a part of your roof permit. The Final Roof Inspection consists of:

- Attic inspection to verify vent piping thru the roof
- Rafters in position
- Water heater and furnace exhaust vents reinstalled properly.
